Foundation for Community Partnerships gives our partners personalized service to meet their goals for giving. Grants are made for charitable or educational activities as defined by Section 501(c)(3) of the IRS Code. In addition, you can be certain that we carefully review every grantee. We study their programs in relation to its goals and objectives and review financial information to insure that Foundation grants are well placed. In considering your grantmaking, keep in mind the Foundation services include local expertise and information on area needs and nonprofit organizations.

Grants for general support or for a specific program or activity may be recommended. For efficient and effective grantmaking, advisors are encouraged to allocate a portion of their grant funds to support the Foundation's community grants program. There are two convenient ways to issue grants through this program; (1) select an agency from the list of designated funds held by the Foundation for Community Partnerships or (2) allocate funds to the General Fund so the Board of Directors may determine how best to distribute grant funds.
